School Assembly for Those Sitting Exams 2023

The following Service is an opportunity to unite students in a moment of prayer and calm before the exams begin. Depending on the pastoral circumstances, it can be adapted for a brief moment of prayer at the beginning of each day. The attached prayer card/book marker can be offered to students sitting exams.

Leader: Sign of the Cross

We come together in prayer this morning to pray for all our students sitting their Junior and Leaving Certificate examinations in our school over the coming weeks.

We turn first in thanks to God for the gift of learning and knowledge. We recognise how privileged we are to have access to courses and examinations, qualifications and training.

We come too, to ask God's help. We ask God to let the Holy Spirit be with us to guide our hearts and minds as we prepare and sit examinations and as we make decisions about our future. We shall now have a short reading from the Gospel of Luke.

Scripture Reading

A Reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Colossians. (1:3-4, 9) We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all God's people. And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding.
