Order of the Mass and Liturgy Plan for Beginning of School Year Mass

The following guide is a sample of a Beginning of the School Year Liturgy. You may choose to use your own hymns or add or change the Liturgy to make it your own.



Opening Hymn; 'Down to the River to Pray' or 'Christ be Our Light'

Words of Welcome

This Mass is to begin our school year. In it we pray for each other, and for the whole school. We are asking God to let his Light Shine through us this school year in everything we do and undertake. We'll also be asking for God's help with our learning, our friendships, our sport, our hobbies, and with everything that is part of our school.

We might feel a bit afraid of the coming year, especially if it's an exam year, or if we feel we don't get on too well in the class. Or we can feel very confident and glad to start again. No matter what, we put ourselves before God and ask his help in the coming year. (Second level only)

And we start by being grateful. There are many things to be grateful for in this group. Pause for a moment now and think of something you are thankful for just now. And then think of what else in your life you say thanks for. Be thankful for your interest in and your enjoyment of sport, or art, or writing, or dancing, or whatever. Be grateful for your health, your intelligence, your body, your mind. Be grateful for your friends; for your teachers; and for being part of this school community.



The Introductory Rite.

'Let your Light Shine' Procession

I now invite our children to come forward to present their symbols and (name of child) will read a short reflection.

First, we bring forward a **candle** representing Jesus, the light of the world. The candle reminds us that in baptism we are called to follow Jesus and that we are challenged to see God in all things. May we always carry the light of Christ with us in our hearts and let our light shine out in the world bringing it to everyone we meet.

Next, we bring forward the **bible**. As we listen to your word Lord, help us to grow to be more like you.

We bring forward a **crucifix**, representing the prayer life of the school. Lord bless the time we spend in prayer. May we always know your love for us and help us Lord to grow in faith, hope and love.

We now bring up a book, a football and a piece of art, representing our learning, play and creativity in school. Lord, help us grow in knowledge, skill, and imagination using our talents always for the good of others.

We bring forward an **image of the Last Supper** where Jesus is surrounded by his friends, representing our friendships. Help us to grow in peace and harmony with everyone in our class and around us. May we always treasure the gift of friendship and always give thanks to our greatest friend, Jesus.

We bring forward a **globe.** This is a reminder that as members of the Body of Christ we are part of a much wider community. Led by the Holy Spirit we should always be aware of the needs of others and be prepared to use our gifts and talents to help and support them.

Finally, we bring forward a **statue** (or a picture) **of St Francis of Assisi**, the patron saint of ecology, to remind us that this is the season of creation. St Francis is a gentle saint who is our example and our inspiration, as to how we should respect and act for Creation. He is a reminder that each decision we make and each small thing we do for creation helps and contributes to the renewal of the earth.



We ask the Lord Jesus, as we begin our new school year, that his love will join us, his wisdom will guide us, his light will shine through us, and his care will protect us throughout the year, AMEN

3:14-21

This then is what I pray, kneeling before the Father: In the abundance of his glory may he, through his Spirit, enable your inner selves to grow strong, so that Christ may live in your hearts through faith, and then, planted in love and built on love, with all God's holy people you will have the strength to grasp the breadth and the length, the height and the depth: so that, knowing the love of Christ, which is beyond all knowledge, you may be filled with the utter fullness of God. Glory be to him whose power, working in us, can do infinitely more than we can ask or image; glory be to him from generation to generation in the Church and in Christ Jesus for ever and ever. Amen.

Then it began to blow a gale, and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped.

But he was in the stern, his head on a cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, "Master, do you not care? We are going down!" And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Quiet now! Be calm!" And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, "Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?" They



were filled with awe and said to one another: "Who can this be? Even the wind and sea obey him".

- 7. During this the season of creation we pray that that we will learn to 'Hope and Act' for God's creation. We pray as individuals and as a school community that we may make sustainable choices and marvel at the wonder and beauty of Creation. Lord, hear us.
- 8. We pray for those in our school and parish community who have died. Teach us to share our light with those who need comforting. Lord, hear us.



Celebrant: Lord, help us to use the talents you have given each of us. Help us bring them to our schoolwork so that we can perform to the best of our ability. May all in this school feel valued, and may all we do and learn, be in your service, and in the service of love, both now and in the future.

We ask this in the name of Jesus our Lord. Amen.
