November Blessing of Graves & Cemetery Prayers



Introduction

Welcome as we gather this afternoon to pray for the eternal rest and peace of all who are buried in this place.

We are conscious of those whose loved ones have been interred here in this cemetery since this time last year. We extend our deepest sympathies to you and your families and assure you of our prayers.

In the face of death, the Church confidently proclaims that God has created each person for eternal life and that Jesus, the Son of God, by his death and resurrection, has broken the chains of sin and death that bound humanity. Christ "achieved his task of redeeming humanity and giving perfect glory to God, principally by the paschal mystery of his blessed passion, resurrection from the dead, and glorious ascension."

In the Book of Maccabees, we are reminded it is a good and wholesome thing to remember the dead, and so we have come to pray and to remember; in faith and hope that our loved ones gone before us are at peace with God in heaven.

Sign of the Cross & Greeting

In the name of the Father ★ and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**

The grace and peace of God our Father, who raised Jesus from the dead, be always with you.

And with your spirit.

Opening Prayer

Almighty God, through the death of your Son on the cross You destroyed our death; through his rest in the tomb You hallowed the graves of all who believe in you; and through his rising again You restored us to eternal life.

God of the living and the dead accept our prayers for those who have died in Christ and are buried with him in the hope of rising again. Since they were true to your name on earth, let them praise you for ever in the joy of heaven.

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

A Reading from the Book of Ecclesiastes (3:1-8)

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven:

A time to be born and a time to die,

A time to plant and a time to uproot,

A time to kill and a time to heal,

A time to tear down and a time to build,

A time to weep and a time to laugh,

A time to mourn and a time to dance,

A time to scatter stones and a time to gather them,

a time to embrace and a time to refrain,

A time to search and a time to give up,

A time to keep and a time to throw away,

A time to tear and a time to mend,

A time to be silent and a time to speak,

A time to love and a time to hate,

A time to war and a time for peace.

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (10:34-36, 42-43)

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'The truth I have now come to realise, he said, 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him. 'It is true, God sent his word to the people of Israel, and it was to them that the good news of peace was brought by Jesus Christ—but Jesus Christ is Lord of all, and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Second Reading

A Reading from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Thessalonians. We want you to be quite certain, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command and the Lord himself will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be taken up in the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. So we shall stay with the Lord for ever.

Or

A Reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans

The life and death of each of us has its influence on others; if we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord, so that alive or dead we belong to the Lord. This explains why Christ both died and came to life, it was so that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living. We shall all have to stand before the judgement seat of God; as scripture says: By my life—it is the Lord who speaks—every knee shall bend before me, and every tongue shall praise God. It is to God, therefore, that each of us must give an account of himself.

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (23:33, 39-43) When the soldiers reached the place called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there and the two criminals also, one on the right, the other on the left.

One of the criminals hanging there abused him. 'Are you not the Christ?' he said. 'Save yourself and us as well.' but the other spoke up and rebuked him. 'Have you no fear of God at all? He said. 'you got the same sentence as he did. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus,' he said, 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied, 'today you will be with me in paradise.'

- 4. As we pray that all buried here in this cemetery will find eternal peace, we pray that the peace that is in heaven will touch the troubled parts of our world, our country, our parish, our homes and our hearts. **Lord**, **hear us.**
- 5. We pray for all whose lives are dedicated to caring for the sick and the dying. We remember those who have accompanied and supported our families during time of illness; may God reward their goodness and kindness. **Lord, hear us.**

6. For ourselves and our community, who have assembled here to worship in faith, that we may be reunited one day with all whom we love, when every tear will be wiped away. **Lord, hear us.**

Lord God, giver of peace and healer of souls, hear the voices of your people, who remember with love and mourn with sadness the loss of their loved ones. We ask these prayers through Christ our Lord. Amen

Blessing of Water

Dear sisters and brothers, let us humbly ask the Lord our God to bless this water which he has created, which will be sprinkled on the graves of our loved ones, recalling the day on which we were baptised.

May he help us by his grace to remain faithful to the Spirit we have received.

Almighty ever-living God, who willed that through water, the fountain of life and source of purity, souls should be cleansed and receive the gift of eternal life;

★ bless this water by which we seek your protection on this your day O Lord.

Renew the living spring of your grace within us, defend us from all evil and grant us and our faithful departed your salvation.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen

Prayer of Blessing Over Graves

Lord,

You have made your people a pilgrim church, to be welcomed by you into its eternal home. By your own three days in the tomb, you hallowed the graves of all who believe in you and so made the grave a sign of hope that promises resurrection. Never cease to remind us of the life that we are to share in Christ, who will transform our earthly bodies to be like his in glory. May your holy angels continue to watch over these graves until we are united with you and our loved ones for ever in heaven. We ask this prayer through Christ our Lord. Amen
