Easter Scavenger Hunt

Find or create things around your house, inside or out, to symbolize these items from the story of Jesus, His crucifixion & resurrection.

Be as creative as possible!



Scavenger Hunt Instructions

- 1. Give each child a copy of the Scavenger hunt. Be sure to explain that they will be looking for something that they think best represents the item from the story of Jesus' crucifixion & resurrection. (Examples: Linens could be a clean tissue, or the bread could be crackers.)
- 2. Be sure to give them appropriate boundaries, e.g. you can go in the kitchen, don't forget to look outside, the garage is out of bounds!
- 3. When everyone is finished, come back together and take time to discuss each item and read the scripture card that goes with it. Talk about what happened & the meaning of each of the items in the Easter story.
